NISHNAABEMWIN APPRENTICESHIP : This is who we are.

Did you know, at times in an infant's life, from 0 to 2 years, 1 million connections/second can be forming in their rapidly growing developing and learning brain? That is why many of us easily learned our first language between the ages of 2 and 5 years old. It takes a few decades for our brains and bodies to mature. By the time we are 25, the brain is fully developed. So as adults, unless we have an affinity to learning languages, learning a second language can be daunting. Language experts are coming to agree that some of the most effective language teachers are those who learned Nishnaabemwin as a second language, even when they are not yet fully fluent. Of course they also require first language speakers to be available as a valuable resource. The combination of a lead instructor, who found his/her way through learning Nishnaabemwin as a second language, AND resource people who are fluent speakers with Nishnaabemwin as their first language is rapidly becoming a best practice. So lets have fun teaching and learning together!

Program Description: Using several Nishnaabemwin resources and a variety of teaching modes this program promises that its graduates will pick up the tools they need to strengthen their proficiency in Nishnaabemwin on their journey to mastery of the language. Some topics to be covered include: Learning Languages – Grammar Jargon; Standardized Nishnaabemwin writing system - roman lithography and syllabics; How to use the lexicon; guidance for self directed learning; class presentations; small group work; Learning about differences between dialects and languages; and most importantly - learning the importance of accepting differences by being open to learn all that one can. Books & other resources will be on sale or available for in-library use. Weekly opening and closing ceremony. Discussions of how the 7 Grandfather Teachings will be actively applied to this program. Discussions of why Language is tied to the land and ceremony. Students will be encouraged to contribute to the ongoing direction of the program when suitable. The occasional Guest Speaker will be brought in - provided time and funds exist. Finally, because learning a second language for adults can be difficult, the Golden Rule is: be kind and patient to oneself and fellow classmates as we take this journey together.

At this time, Anishnaabek Communities are in an extremely advantageous position compared to our fellow First Nation People on Turtle Island – we still have an abundance of fluent speakers living among us.

Now is the time for us, our friends and allies (meaning those who are willing and ready) to empower ourselves and our spirits by taking hold of the many tools within in our reach to begin the journey of learning Nishnaabemwin as our second language.

Did you know – in as short a time as one generation, the Anishnaabek Nations can raise ourselves back up to a level of 100% fluent speakers?

Will you join us in this class as we begin that journey together?

Now is the time - if not now, then the reverse is also true - in one generation, we too can also see our numbers of fluent speakers slip away like many other First Nations across Canada and the United States.

We at KTEI are looking for 30 individuals committed to begin (or to continue) their journey to learning Nishnaabemwin, not for college or university credits, but simply because – THIS IS WHO WE ARE.

Note to Employers KTEI has set up this program as an Apprenticeship in hopes that First Nation Administration Offices and Organizations that Service First Nation People (ie Employers - who are committed to having their employees pursue Nishnaabemwin as a second language) will see this one year program as an extraordinary Professional Development opportunity for their staff.
